

# Easter Challenge 2023

How Many Can You Complete? (Always ask permission from an adult before completing an activity)

<p>Draw a picture of a member of your family. You could use crayons or paints to colour your picture and make a frame for it to go in.</p> <p>(1 credit upon submission of picture or a photo of your picture)</p> <p><b>yellow2519</b></p>	<p>Grow a 'Cress Head' on your windowsill. Draw a face on a boiled egg before you eat it. Keep the empty shell (with the face drawn on it). Carefully push some cotton wool or tissue inside the empty shell and wet it. (The cotton wool should be moist, but not soaking) Sprinkle cress seeds over the moist cotton wool. Leave your cress head propped upright on a sunny windowsill.</p> <p>Keep the cotton wool/tissue moist. Your cress head should grow green hair! (Cress tastes nice sprinkled on salads or sandwiches!)</p> <p>(1 credit for submission of a picture of your cress head to your teacher)</p> <p><b>purple4998</b></p>	<p>Find a poem that you really like, either from a book or online. (Choose a poem that is not too short but is not too long to learn off by heart.) Try to learn it so you can recite it from memory. (Sometimes it's best to do this bit by bit – e.g. one verse at a time.) Now you can perform your poem to family and friends.</p> <p>(1.5 credits for reciting your poem to your teacher)</p> <p><b>yellow4421</b></p>
<p>Plant some nasturtium seeds. (You can find nasturtium seeds in most supermarkets or discount shops.) Read the instructions on the packet first. Nasturtiums grow well in pots or straight in the soil.</p> <p>(1 credit on submission of a diagram or description of how you planted your nasturtiums)</p> <p><b>yellow0983</b></p>	<p>Decorate an egg for Easter. Use a hard-boiled egg. Wash it in washing up liquid first, then dry it. Now you can use your felt tips to design your own coloured Easter egg. (Try out your designs on paper first.)</p> <p>(1.5 credits upon submission of picture of your coloured egg)</p> <p><b>green2925</b></p>	<p>Design an Easter Egg hunt for your friends/family. Make a set of cards to hide in different places in your home or garden. Each card has a clue for how to find the next card. The final clue takes you to an Easter egg.</p> <p>(1.5 credits upon picture of Eater Egg Hunt clue cards)</p> <p><b>orange3487</b></p>
