GOSPEL REFLECTION



No sooner has Jesus appointed Peter to be the rock on which the Church is founded and praised him for recognizing him as "The Christ, the Son of the living God", than he castigates Peter for being Satan, and obstacle in his path. Peter's reaction is one that we all have when we see an innocent person about to suffer unjustly. We have an innate aversion to suffering, especially innocent, unjust suffering. But Jesus wants to take his followers on to another level. Jesus wants them understand that suffering has immense value in the eyes of God. We may react strongly to Jesus telling us that we must take up our cross and follow him, but he is not mincing his words. What the experience of the cross teaches us is that suffering can be turned into love. In fact, suffering born out of love, has the power to convert and

redeem and to bring sinners back to God. The world does everything to avoid suffering and sees it only as something negative. It is true that, as Christians, we want to help those who suffer, but on a personal level, Jesus invites us to see in every suffering a precious pearl which can transform hearts, minds and souls.

144. It also gives rise to healthy and enriching exchanges. The experience of being raised in a particular place and sharing in a particular culture gives us insight into aspects of reality that others cannot so easily perceive. Universal does not necessarily mean bland, uniform and standardized, based on a single prevailing cultural model, for this will ultimately lead to the loss of a rich palette of shades and colours, and result in utter monotony. Such was the temptation referred to in the ancient account of the Tower of Babel. The attempt to build a tower that would reach to heaven was not an expression of unity between various peoples speaking to one another from their diversity. Instead, it was a misguided attempt, born of pride and ambition, to create a unity other than that willed by God in his providential plan for the nations (cf. Gen 11:1-9).

GOD'S WHEAT

I am writing to all the Churches and issuing instructions to all that I am dying willingly for God and that you are not to hinder this. I beg you not to help me with untimely kindness. Let me be food for the wild beasts through whom I can come to God. I am God's wheat, and I am ground down by the teeth of wild animals, so that I may be made into the pure bread of Christ.

I would prefer you to entice the wild animals to become my tomb, leaving nothing of my bodily remains behind, so that I shall not be a burden to anyone after I am gone. Then I shall truly be a disciple of Jesus Christ, when the world can no longer even see my body.

Pray to Christ for me that I may be a worthy sacrifice through these instruments. I am not ordering you as did Peter and Paul, for they were apostles while I am a convict; they were free while I am still a slave. But if I suffer, I shall be Jesus Christ's own freedman, and in him I shall rise again in freedom.

What I am learning from my chains at present is not to desire anything.
