We will soon launch the 100 CLUB which will be a great way for you to support us whilst having a bit of a flutter! Here's how it works...

You complete and sign a membership form, Standing Order mandate, or bank details for £5 per month.

This buys you one membership number (we will allocate), which enters you into the monthly draw. All participants must be over 16.

The draw will take place on the last Friday Assembly each month.

If you win, cash can be collected from School and the name of the winner published in the school's newsletter.

The prize money will be 50% of the membership fee taken that month. The remaining 50% goes to the PFA to help fund our targets for the year.

Purpose - The purpose of the 100 Club is to raise funds. The money will be paid into the PFA bank account and used to meet funding requests from the school, providing equipment, resources and opportunities for pupils.

How can you help?

Just one hour, or more if you can spare:

Put simply, the funds raised and the events organised for our children will not happen without parents giving up their time.
