## **GOSPEL REFLECTION**



At first glance this Gospel seems very harsh. The person who buries the talent is given a sharp rebuke, but it is a warning to all of us that whatever talents we are given are not just our personal property to have and to keep and to do whatever we want with. Everything we have, our intelligence, our health, our children, are given to us by God so that we may serve him and love him and serve and love our fellow humans. We are living in times when we are told we have lots of 'rights', including the right to do whatever we want with our bodies, our talents, our possessions. But if we listen carefully to what Jesus tells us, the only 'right' we have is to love. This gives us a completely different view of life: we are not here simply to fulfil our worldly ambitions; we are here to build the Kingdom of God among us. And at the end of our lives we will be judged on how we have contributed to the building of this Kingdom. However, we can't do this if all our efforts are concentrated on building a 'better' life for ourselves. If, on the other hand, we put our talents and our capabilities at the service of humanity, we will both fulfil ourselves and help bring about God's Kingdom on earth.

#### POPULAR VS. POPULIST

156. In recent years, the words "populism" and "populist" have invaded the communications media and everyday conversation. As a result, they have lost whatever value they might have had, and have become another source of polarization in an already divided society. Efforts are made to classify entire peoples, groups, societies and governments as "populist" or not. Nowadays it has become impossible for someone to express a view on any subject without being categorized one way or the other, either to be unfairly discredited or to be praised to the skies.

## The Fire of Love\*

## DISCERNING THE RIGHT KIND OF LOVE

We all know that we can never be filled with a love of eternity or anointed with the sweet oil of heaven unless we are genuinely converted to God. We have to turn from worldly things, even if only in our minds. This means loving what we ought to love, and not loving what we ought to hate.

We must love God first and foremost, and then other heavenly things. Only necessary love should be given to what is earthly. We must desire nothing but Christ and eschew all that is false and would pervert our steps into the paths of wickedness. It is possible to find people like this who have no taste for earthly things and deal with worldly matters no more than is strictly necessary, but they are few.

Those who get rich find comfort in what they have (at least for now) so they are not necessarily entitled to enjoy even a little of this heavenly love. They think they should be given future bliss because they have a surface kind of devotion. But as their love for earthly treasures is unlimited, the fire of love in them will come to nothing. Moreover, they will lack the sweetness that God gives to his true lovers. They enjoy only a counterfeit 'love' which brings them no good in the long run.
