IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING GIFT AID

Gift Aid relates to individuals and not couples. In order to comply with HMRC Gift Aid rules it is necessary for donations made by bank credit (of any type) or cheque, to be made from a sole or joint account on which the person who signed the Gift Aid form is a signatory. Please take this into consideration if you currently Gift Aid your donations via the numbered envelope system then change to donate via the church bank account, otherwise it will not be possible to claim Gift Aid on your donations.
