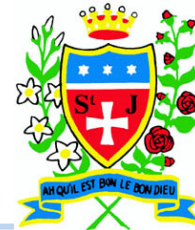

Things to try:

Everyday Objects- In pairs, children grab a handful of objects, such as cubes, beads or conkers. Can your partner hold more than you, fewer than you or the same amount as you?

Object sort- Provide objects for children to sort into two sets. Ask children which set has more. Which set has fewer? Can children make two sets which are the same? How do they know they are the same?

Counting: Use numbered finger puppets. Which number comes next? Blow out five candles in a row, counting as you go. Count up the stairs.
