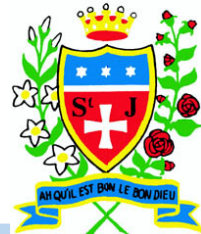


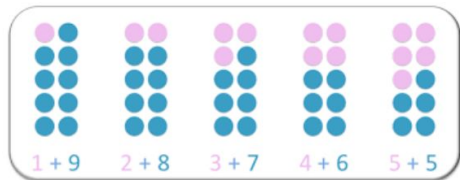

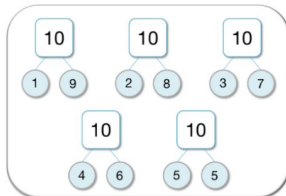

The secret to success is practising little and often. Use time wisely. Can you practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey?

Questions to ask at home

- What do we need to add to 7 to make 10?
- If I have 4, how many more do I need to get to 10?
- What is $2 + 8$?

Key vocabulary

2 add 8 equals 10
8 plus 2 is the same as 10
10 add 0 makes 10
6 plus 4 totals

Things to try:

Everyday items- Using items around the house to find different ways of making 10, e.g one blue teddy and nine red teddies. One and nine make ten. **Making up stories-** with items around the home, e.g there are 2 cars in the car park and 8 more cars arrive, how many cars altogether? Two and eight make ten.

Asking questions during daily routines, e.g you have 4 sausages on your plate and I have 6 sausages on my plate, how many sausages altogether? Four and six make ten.

Water gun numbers- Write the numbers 1-10 on large pieces of paper, shout out a number 1-10 and then ask your child to shoot the right number to make 10.
