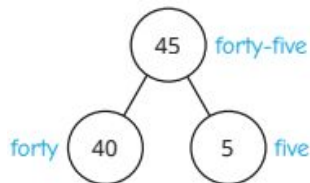

Make sure that your child is pronouncing the numbers correctly and not getting confused between **thirteen** and **thirty**.

## Things to try

- **Spot the number-** Around the house there are lots of numbers. Challenge children to find as many as they can- say them, write them and maybe say one more one less.
- **Money-** Give the children some 10p and 1p coins- ask them to count them and work out what the number is. Say and write.
- **Number match-** create cards (download) where you can match the number written as a word to the in numerals
- e.g. forty five = 45
- **100 Square-** use a 100 square to play lots of different games- find this number, three in a row.
