

KIRF- I can recall durations of time

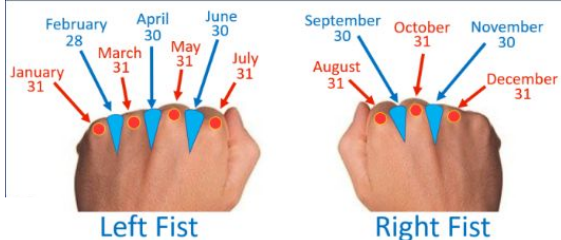


Year 3 - Summer 2

Things to try to help remember these key facts especially days in each month (as this is the trickiest part)

Knuckles: Months with 31 Days

Gaps: Months with less than 31 Days



Rhymes and memory games

30 days has September, April, June and November.

All the rest have 31, except February, it's the one, which only has 28 days clear, and 29 in each leap year.

Matching game- place days (30,31,28/29) on some cards and months on the others.

Bingo- Choose 6 months and place in grid. Create a way of choosing 30,31,28/29 and then cross off month with that number of days.

Questions to ask: When's your birthday – What month is your mum/dad/brother/sister's birthday? How many days are there in it? What month comes before your mum/dad/brother/sister's birthday? Which month comes afterwards? How many days are in those months?

As part of their time learning, it is always great to help the children become confident in reading the time to the nearest minute.

To support them please practise reading the time on both analogue and digital clocks at home.

Questions to ask at home

- How many days are in one year?
- How many days are in a leap year?
- What day comes before February 1st?
- How many minutes in 2 hours?
- How many minutes in half an hour?
- How many days in a week?

Key facts:

There are 60 **seconds** in a **minute**

There are 60 **minutes** in a **hour**

There are 24 **hours** in a **day**

There are 7 **days** in a **week**

There are 12 **months** in a **year**

There are 365 (366) **days** in a **year**

In a **leap year** there is an **extra day** in February
